They seem to do better in miles per gallon in the city than on the road because they "turn off" the gasoline engine while at a stop. I was with this car for a couple of lights and it was interesting to see it work. I would watch the exhaust and while at a stop, there was no smoke but as soon as it started forward. I could see the exhaust smoke coming out. Technology at work but a couple questions came to my mind. We always hear that most engine wear occurs at start up as opposed to just driving the car so if this engine cycles off and on as frequently as it does, does that mean that these motors are more likely go bad? What about the "warm up" during those cold days when first started. Does the gasoline motor warm up as a regular engine would? Does the battery portion stay off during this time until the gas portion warms up? If it does not, then it would take it longer to get to operating temperature and hence warm up the cabin. Plus the oil may never heat up as compared to a regular gasoline engine so it may have more difficultly in removing moisture from inside the engine leading to rust internally and early failure.... hmmmm...I don't know. What about the exhaust system. Will it rust out prematurely as well? If the car does not warm up as much and the condensation in the pipes and muffler never gets blown out then will a person be replacing the exhaust system on a more frequent basis? I don't know the answer but I am sure these questions were thought of by the engineers involved. With gas prices continuing to increase for whatever reason these cars seem to be getting more popular but I am still not sold 100%. I personally feel

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diesel motors are a better alternative but people still have a negative impression of them here in the states as opposed to our friends in Europe. Rumor has it that Nissan will be bringing a diesel option for the Maxima for 2010 but believe it or not this is not the first time that they sold a diesel Maxima in this country. Does anyone remember when that was? I believe it was the 1981-1983 Datsun Maxima where they used the L28 block from the 280ZX. Now there is some interesting trivia.
