The weather was perfect again at the Rolling Meadows Cruise Night on June 5. It seems to be like that each time we go. As usual we had to be there early to get a spot to park. I know many of you just can't make it there due to work and travel time. Thanks to Ty for holding the spot for us. I arrived at 6:30 and without the saved spaces it would have been difficult to find one. There were literally hundreds of great muscle cars, street rods, etc. I shot a few pictures of our group, but I was lazy that night and didn't walk around and shoot pictures of other cars.

I am looking for a new daily driver, my 1996 Bonneville has served it's purpose as a short term daily drier and a teenage driving instruction car and it's time to pass it on to my daughter now that she will have a summer job. Generally the plan now is for me to find a relatively inexpensive used car daily driver that's fun to drive. It also should have four doors and seating for four tall people as an emergency backup to my wife's family truckster – the Honda Pilot. We went to Continental Nissan and looked at and drove a few cars. We had to eliminate the used Sentra SE-R they had on the lot before driving it as it had too little headroom in the backseat for our tall family. I drove an Altima 3.5 and it has made the cut as it had good headroom in the back as well as great handling and acceleration.

We (or should I say, my wife – as she fell in love with it at the Chicago Auto) also test drove a Nissan Cube. We drove the Krom edition which is the top of the line version. She actually drove the car, because in this case she would end up as the primary driver instead of myself. It is intended to compete with the Toyota Xb and the new Kia Soul as one of the new breed of

box cars. Basically they are high style, economical city cars. Style of course is a personal subjective value. My wife just love the way it looks and I can agree that



it has a certain fun, cool style to it. It certainly is spacious and versatile, has plenty of headroom, legroom and cargo room. It's fully equipped, with all versions including the base version having ABS, stability and traction control systems, tire pressure monitoring and 6 standard air bags. As you go up line you get into better stereos, Bluetooth, larger wheels, etc. There is one engine available, a 122 hp 1.8 liter. 28 mpg city, 30 mpg highway – good in the this age of higher gas prices, With the poor state of the economy, prices been low, but now it seems to be creeping up again – not back to \$4.00 gallon gas yet, but it's approaching \$3.00/gallon. My driving impressions that follows are from the passenger seat, as it would be her car, and we had limited time to move on to test drive the other cars. Plenty of room and a good view of the gauges. Good ergonomics and usability of the functions such as radio and HVAC. Acceleration with my wife, myself, and the salesman in it – not so good. Better plan your merges carefully on the highway. Motor Trend gives the 0-60 mph time as 9.3 seconds, about on par with my 1980 280 ZX, although it felt slower than my Z, perhaps due to having three good size adults in it. The transmission was a CVT; perhaps the 6-spd manual on the base version would make it a little more fun to drive for a car guy like most of us are. Handling and braking felt very good, and the turning circle seemed very tight giving the car good maneuverability. It's made it past the first cut, although as the only new car on my list it's somewhat higher than my target price for adding another car to the Pleiter stable, especially in the Krom version. Once I have driven a few more potential candidates, narrowed down the list to select finalists, and crunched budget numbers, I'll have to drive it myself and see how good a deal we can get on a midlevel trim. In the mean time, I am open to suggestions, or to a line on a good daily driver.
