The next event will be a Planning Party/Z General Meeting to be held at 6 pm on January 9, 2011 at my house. The purpose will be to work on planning the Midwest Heritage Z Fest we are hosting in June and to look at events for next year. One new thing I am planning for 2011 is to use to E-vites for announcing and receiving RSVPs for the club events. This will enable us to get the word out and RSVPs back with comments and so everyone is aware of who is planning to attend. So look for an E-vite for the next meeting with address and details. I will probably send it out between Christmas and New Year's. Also, Ty has confirmed that we will again be able to get about 20 tickets to the Chicago Auto Show. The date is usually the first Monday of the Show – Valentine's Day this year, so put it on the calendar.
