So what’s happening with Nissan and the Z Car? We were supposed to have heard some details now about the next

generation Z, at least that is what seemed to come out of what Nissan told the people at the last International Z Convention. It seems like some of the original magic from Carlos Ghosn seems to have worn off at Nissan. The latest Nissan Versa and Sentra was universally panned by the car community as being a step backward. The new Rogue has been reviewed as mediocre, with the CVT transmission hit especially hard by the critics. However, the Altima is both a critical and sales hit and the new Note and Pathfinder have received good reviews. The latest Maxima had OK reviews, but is not really the 4 door sports car of yore.

The new SSC concept (future Maxima) looks pretty good if having a bit of a busy exterior design, especially the “V-motion graphic grill”. Hope that stays off the new Z. Maybe the Maxima will be handsome when it arrives. October Motor Trend reported sources say Andy Palmer Executive VP of Nissan was made personally responsible for the driving dynamics of new Nissan cars and has already sent a couple of cars back to the development teams for more work. Maybe this bodes good news for the Z. On the other hand, the latest (March) Motor Trend suggested that Nissan may be pursuing the Blade Glide and IDx concpets that have been doing the auto show rounds, and if both come to fruition it could spell the death of the 370Z. Generally I like the IDX in general proportion and idea, but the concepts currently look a little too much like snap together plastic model kits. The Blade Glider concept looks a little too radical to make it production, so I am hopeful the new Z is really all new and neither dead nor a minor evolution of the 370Z.

So what is up with the new Z? Not much news out there except it is to be smaller and lighter. After the Subaru BRZ and Toyota companion car came out, I wouldn’t be surprised if the new Z had to go back to the drawing board, as these would be serious competitors for people shopping a sports car. The new Mustang and other pony cars are also competitors. So Nissan, in the opinion of this one Z enthusiast, you need to step up your game in general, and for the Z in particular. Need something with a clean design, light and fast. You need to match or better 370Z performance, and should leave plenty of robust design in the engine for tuners. Mike Piasowski – Director of Exterior Design for the next Ford Mustang said that part of the process in designing the next generation

Mustang was to take individual details off the concept one at a time and see if it was needed. “If it still looked like a Mustang, we kept it off” he said. Sounds like a good philosophy to me for design of the next generation Z.

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Nissan News

Nissan had a good year in 2013 with 1,131,965 sales, up 10.8% from 2012 whereas Infiniti was down 2.9% to 116,455 sales. Leading the way was the Altima with 320,723 units sold, up 5.9%. The Z did not fare as well with 6,561 sales, down 10.6% from 7338 sales. The GTR actually did better this past year with 1,236 sales, up 4%. Other notable figures include the electric Leaf with sales totaling 22,610, up 130%!! The Leaf has now sold over 100,000 globally, with the 100,000th sale in the United Kingdom. This makes it the best selling electric vehicle in history with a market share of 45%. Unfortunately the Cube was down the most with 5,461 sales, down 28.8% (sorry Allie).

Nissan will attempt to get its 3rd victory at the Rolex 24 at Daytona in February. Nissan was the first Japanese manufacturer to win the overall coveted race in 1992. They had taken the lead on the second lap of the race and never looked back. The distance record for the Nissan team that year of 2,712,720 miles (762

laps) still holds today. Two years later they won it again with a margin of victory of 24 laps.



The Nissan Sport Sedan Concept made its debut at the North American International Auto Show in Detroit. The design concepts may be adapted into future Nissan models. This concept reveals the new “V-Motion” front end that flows from the front grill up through the hood. It is powered by a 300+ hp 3.5litre V-6 with a sport tuned Xtronic CVT transmission. Autoweek has already named it the Best Concept at this Auto Show. Lets see if it will make it to Chicago.

Last but not least, Nissan celebrated 80 years of building cars on December 26th 2013. They had a parade of over 100 Nissan and Datsun heritage cars on the streets of Yokohama, Japan commemorating the event. Happy Birthday Nissan!
