of out club through the years has always been appreciated. Our usual Starbucks meeting point was moved to the other side of the floor but we were still able to find each before we headed in. As usual we headed straight for the Nissan display to see the beloved Z. They had a 2014 NISMO in Solid Red with a sticker price of \$45,180. That's it, no other Z's. Sure it was nice and all but as a consumer for a sports car, this is pretty pricey. If I were in the marketing business for Nissan, I would certainly tell them to put a more

affordable Z on display, perhaps the base \$29, 990 version. Many buyers are looking at this price range to buy a sport car. The Subaru BRZ starts at \$25,595, the Scion FR-S at \$25,255 and the Hyundai Genesis at \$26,350. Granted these are not in the same class as the Z but back in 1969-1970 when the 240Z came out, it undercut the other sports cars out there with the price but it had the handling etc to match. That's where it all

started. I would hate to see Nissan loose Z sales to these other cars who are now undercutting the Z in price but the truth is that Z sales are indeed down and in my opinion, this is a big reason for it. As far as other Nissan products, the Altima is definitely a nice 4 door sedan with cleaner lines than the Maxima which is getting a bit dated. The whole display was kind of bland, again in my opinion. No pizzazz. I know I have



critiqued their display in the past but even Honda and Toyota could have used more spice. Just like the Japanese cars came in to the market 40 yrs ago, now the Koreans are taking their spot in building flashy cars with a lot of "bling bling" but at a reasonable price. Hyundai has a nice looking lineup and now Kia is definitely coming along as well.

As far as Infiniti, why did they change the names of each model? Maybe I just have to get used to it but to me, a G37 is a G37, not a Q60...or was that a Q50. Hmmm.

My favorite car of the show? This year, the award goes to the Jaguar F-Type. A beautiful 2 door coupe that was dressed in red. It also is available in a

convertible but the coupe had better lines.



Also, I don't know if you had the time to go to the back but they had a Chicago Auto Show time-line with various pictures and special events shown. They even had a picture from the 1976 Datsun area with a 280Z. Pretty cool!
