

An interesting Z Car showed up on e-bay recently. ASC, a well known shop that modifies cars for manufacturers created a one off retractable hard top convertible concept as a proposal to Nissan. It was built based on a 1991 300ZX 2 +2 for the 1992 Geneva Auto Show. Nissan passed, but the concept lived on in the Mitsubishi 3000 Spyder retractable hardtop. The car was bought by a member of zcar.com, and I expect we'll see it at the National Convention.



In addition to the release of Nissan's Leaf full electric vehicle, rumors are now flying about a 2011 Hybrid 370Z. Word is that the car will have the same 3.7L engine with the addition of an electric motor capable of up to 35 mpg.

If you plan on going to the National Convention July 28 to August 1, registration is now open, a discount is now offered to Z Club members, and early bird registration ends April 1<sup>st</sup>. 
