

#### Z's in the Woods 2014 Directions-Kokomo

Follow I-65 South until you reach **Exit #172 to Rossville**. As you exit from I-65, turn left at the stop light onto Route 26 towards the East.(Rossville) Drive approximately 45 minutes to Kokomo. Be alert for RT. 931, which is "old US 31". This intersection has White's Meat Market on the left and a Marathon station on the right. There is a Speedway station and a CVS on the other side of RT 931. Turn left (North) at the stoplight onto RT.931 and proceed to Southway Blvd and turn right onto Southway. Ruby Tuesday's is on the left, Mancino's is on the right. Continue East as this road winds through a residential neighborhood. You will come to a 4 way stop sign, which is Albright Road. This is only .9 miles from Rt 931. Continue to proceed East up a slight hill and at the top on your right is an entrance marked "STONYBROOK". This is 1.3 miles from RT 931. This street is Beechwood. Turn right. Almost immediately, there is a stop sign, turn right again. This is Greytwig Drive. Proceed down the street and stay to the right on this street marked "No Outlet". Our house is the **4<sup>th</sup> house on the left** from the corner and is orange brick with green shutters. You have found us! 2001 Greytwig Drive, Telephone 765.455.1129. Cell Phone 765.513.9134. Driving time from Chicago Westside is about 3 hours depending upon traffic.

#### Alternate Route from the North Via US 31

Drive down US 31 from the north. Stay on US 31 (the new bypass) that now goes on the east side of Kokomo. Take Exit #161 to "East Blvd". Turn right at this exit onto East Blvd and proceed to Goyer Road at the first stoplight. Turn left and proceed south on Goyer Rd. This road ends in a T, which is Southway Blvd. Turn right and travel a short distance to the entrance to "STONYBROOK" on left. This street is Beechwood. Turn left. Almost immediately, there is a stop sign, turn right. This is Greytwig Drive. Proceed down the street and stay to the right on this street marked "No Outlet". Our house is the **4<sup>th</sup> house on the left** from the corner and is orange brick with green shutters. You have found us! 2001 Greytwig Drive, Telephone 765.455.1129. 
