Bill Brag, one of the original Club members became Treasurer for 1979 (I guess he likes the job)

Those were the days most of us spent a lot of time on the autocross track. We learned that the early Z's were better cars then we thought, and we were not as good of a driver as we thought. John Kouns always ran a Drivers School. Weekends at Road America and "The Z Zone" outside turn 14 was always a popular event. I remember when some of the Z race cars used CB radios for communications with the pits. We would have a beverage or two and listen in.

Of course there were social events like the annual picnic. There was tons of fun, food, and friends. One the favorite games was the 1973 / 74 carb toss. Anyone who knows the carbs knew they were pure junk. We would take turns tossing them at tin pie plates and see who get the closest.

We made great friends with the club. We came to Tucson to visit Jerry DeGrazia, one of the very early WCZC members. He is the original owner of a hot 1971 240 Z and a GTR. Then Chris and Larry Wawrzyniak came to visit and stayed. They joined the WCZC about the same time as we did. He is the original owner of a 1977 280 Z which is untouched and original with about 19,000 miles.

ZCON Report:

ZCON 2017 was held in Austin, Texas and was attended by WCZC members myself and Allie, Tom and Sharon Keene, Carl and Judy Kush, Ron and Debbie Janicki (WCZC members living in Arizona), and Jon Millan. We all drove different days and routes, so there was no WCZC caravan. Allie and I drove the Nismo (2 days on the road each way). This was the first time she drove the Z for any significant amount of time. She has driven manual transmission cars for many years and was comfortable driving the car. We had no issues with weather or traffic, on the way there or back. There are pictures in the newsletter and on the website for those who did not follow us on Facebook.

As expected, the temperatures were hot, mid to upper 90s, but the humidity was not too bad, and there was a bit of a breeze and clouds for most of the event, so it did not really affect the activities too much except for Friday, when it hit 104 (I'll talk more about that later).

Capital Z Club of Texas hosted the event and I have to give them compliments for a very well run convention and great events. A brief summary:

Tuesday

Suds and Shine. Our window had a view of where they were setting up, so I was able to be the first one there. No waiting and not too hot yet. We met up with my son and

his girlfriend (UT Austin Students), registered for the convention, and attended the opening reception. Food was very good and a full meal, which is not always the case. Texas chili party is a tradition, although the chili was milder than I remember.

Wednesday

Judged Car Show at the Oasis at Lake Travis. Hot day, in the 90s, but very breezy, so it did not seem too bad. If you got too hot, you could go into the Oasis Restaurant and cool off. A few shops there as well. For dinner, we had the upper level of the restaurant to ourselves, very nice buffet of Tex Mex Food. The balcony looked out over Lake Travis. A beautiful view as the sun set. Great fun with friends.

Thursday

HDPE track day at Harris Hill Road. Allie and I opted instead, for a self guided Hill Country cruise to Fredricksburg, where we had a great lunch and roamed through a few shops. Back to Austin in time for the ZCCA business meeting, where the bid for the next ZCON was presented and approved. 2018 ZCON is in Atlanta in mid-October, so not in the heat of the summer. Exact dates TBD. I expect this will be a great convention as two Z Clubs and Z1 will be involved in the planning and events. Track will be Road Atlanta. Following the meeting, we were bussed down to 6th Street, where they let us off at an odd location way up from the main 6th Street bars. I assume some of the crowd made it down there, but seven of us ended up at True Food Restaurant nearby, where the food was good and “nutrient dense” as the waitress told us several times. My son and his girlfriend picked us up from there and took us to Prohibition Creamery for dessert, where you can get ice cream made with alcohol, ice cream with liquor poured over it, or just plain ice cream. They also had a full bar. I had the delicious whiskey chocolate ice cream.

Friday

I skipped the autocross and Allie and I again struck out into Austin on our own to meet up with lunch with my son, his girlfriend, and her parent's. First time we met the parents, must be serious. There were also tech talks by Z designers during the day which I also missed. We arrived back at the hotel about 3:30 and found out people were already headed out to the parade laps at Circuit of the Americas (COTA) for which I had signed up. It was scheduled to start at 5 pm, but people were being told to be there at 4pm for gridding up. This was the hottest day with a temp of 104 degrees, so I was not

ready to head right out onto the hot asphalt and was seriously considering not going out there at all. I asked Tom Keene to keep me updated via text as they were heading out there as we came in. Regular updates came in and the time dragged by with them still sitting out on the asphalt, being told there was a delay. Tom suggested Allie and I go out to dinner before heading to the track. So Allie and I headed out to the Hula Hut for some Hawaiian Tex-Mex food on the shore of Lake Austin, pretty much bagging the idea of sitting on the hot asphalt for a few parade laps on COTA. Turns out 100 of the 300 cars registered to do the parade laps also were no show due to the heat. Well the ones who did go to the track finally made it onto the track about 6:30 pm for a few laps and a group photo. The advertised 3 hours of parade lap time ended up being much less, although those who did go enjoyed the time on the track. Really this was the only problem during the convention, of which I was aware.. We later heard from one of the organizers that AMG Mercedes had thrown a bunch of money at the track well after the ZCCA had their contract, buying out Friday and Saturday, with the result that the ZCCA could not get the track until much later on Friday (6:30 PM) than planned (5 pm). Word was that the ZCCA contract with the track was not specific enough, and COTA was able to bend their commitment to the ZCCA to accommodate the big spenders.

Saturday

Saturday was the people's choice car show at the COTA. It had rained overnight and early in the morning and the day turned out to be mostly cloudy and in the 80s. A bunch of great Z Cars and a few other Datsuns and Nissans. The closing banquet was held in the media center of the COTA. A really nice place for the banquet. Food was the best I ever had at a Z Convention. The people's choice trophies had been awarded at the end of the show earlier, and the autocross trophies were to be mailed later. The bucket raffle prizes were pulled before the banquet and a pdf was posted on the ZCON social media and web pages, so you only had to check your raffle numbers on your phone and pick them up after the dinner. So this made the banquet program shorter, with just speakers, a few live auction items, and the announcement of Atlanta for next year's convention. Mad Mike did his usual schtick.

That is a brief summary due to the newsletter space constraints. Catch me at one of our events for more details. Kudo's again to ZCCA and Capital Z of Texas for a well run convention. No they did not give out any info on the next Z.
