Barb & I ordered our 240Z in October of 1970 and got married the same month. The Safari Gold Z finally joined us in June 7, 1971 and we've been together ever since. We didn't intend to keep the car forever but the ever-tightening safety and emissions regulations during the 70s resulted in cars that didn't inspire the urge for something new and by the time they did we had become too attached to the GOLDNOLZ. (Our vanity plate that not everyone gets).

Our focus was not to keep the car bone stock to maximize resale value but rather to keep messing with it to make it more pleasant to look at and more fun to drive. Thus the early addition of the American Racing "Libre" wheels (I liked their look on the BRE Datsuns), a BRE "Spook" front spoiler to address a "wind wander" issue at higher speeds, and an ANSA rear muffler. Later modifications included headers and a different cam for better breathing.

I think the primary reason we continue to own the car is that the styling has aged quite well. It still looks very good to us. We have many photos of it but my favorite is the one accompanying this article of Mr K standing next to it. This picture was taken in the Z Zone at Road America I believe in 1997. The Windy City Z Club hosted Mr. Katayama and his entourage that weekend, for which Datsun/Nissan was the featured marque and Mr. K was an honored guest. He was a most gracious and charming gentleman. It was an honor to shake the hand of the man whose vision and perseverance produced the car that has now been a part of our lives for 46 years and counting.

Upcoming Events (look for upcoming Evites and info on the website.):

Fall Fling to Wisconsin - October 1. Meet at the Starbucks on Butterfield Road at Downers Drive, at 8:30 am or meet us at the Suisse House in Monroe, WI at 11 am. This will be a modified version of the drive we have done from Monroe to New Glarus. Some roads will be the same, some will be different. The drive will stick to more of the main roads, avoiding potential resealed and sanded roads, and will be shorter. There appears to be a model train museum where we can stop along the way. The plan will be to spend some time in New Glarus and/or at the New Glarus Brewery. The fall colors won't be in full swing, but I hope that makes for more open roads. This trip is subject to rescheduling to October 15th, if the weather is bad on Oct. 1. Note that I-90 construction appears to be finished, so the plan would be to go up I-355 to I-90 and head west instead of I-88 to Rt. 39, as we have done in the past. I plan on doing a verification drive next weekend. If you are interested in joining me on the verification drive, perhaps because you can't make Oct. 1st, let me know ASAP.

Oktoberfest hosted Continental Nissan. October 7 from 11 am to 2 pm. This is a show and shine event that happens rain or shine, so come with or without your Z as weather dictates. Continental will provide food and drink, and usually has a few raffle items to give away to club members.

Recently, Allie and I went to visit our daughter, and as we often do, we tied in a mini vacation / book research into the trip. We flew into Asheville, NC and headed into the mountains to Maggie Valley NC. This is about ½ hour from Tail of the Dragon. Our standard car rental reservation was not available, so we were upgraded to an Infinity QX 70. A nice upgrade, although it was the base version I believe. It had power with the 3.7L engine and was pretty comfortable to drive/ride in. The Blue Ridge Parkway was nearby, so I was able to tie a couple of hours of scenic curvy roads that included the Parkway, followed by an even tighter, curvier and challenging road down from the Parkway down into the valley, where Allie did an interview with a local outfitter store and we had some great BBQ out of a food truck. I was a bid surprised by the handling of the QX70. I expected a modern Infiniti SUV that seemed to have some sporting aspirations, to have a bit better handling. It did corner relatively flat, at least as compared to my DD Honda Pilot. But the steering was slow to respond to inputs. You had to allow for a bit of time to pass before it responded. You had to be thinking about moving the wheel about a second ahead of when you wanted the adjustment for the curve. I was very similar, in timing and seat of the pants feel, to my 280ZX, but with more mass. I think my Honda Pilot responds quicker to inputs, although it has more body roll. Anyway, I guess my expectations were unrealistic for the QX. The roads and scenery were awesome though, and I am thinking that if I do go to ZCON next year, routing the drive down through this area and taking some of these roads might be the way to go.
