<u>Treasurer</u> - Bill Bragg has long kept track of our finances and will continue to do so.

Future Activities:

<u>Chicago Auto Show</u> is scheduled for February 12-21, 2022. I expect they will have the new Z.

ZCON & Midwest Z Heritage: we had anticipated holding it in July 2022 because the ZCCA Convention was being possibly held in September. However, the ZCCA Convention in Birmingham, Alabama has been revised to the dates of July 25-30 due to track availability. I expect that it will be a hot one. At least the judged car show will be indoors. We now plan to have MZH in early September - tentatively weekend of September 9-11 and will soon start planning again in earnest. We do not have a contract yet so dates are tentative. Eaglewood Resort is where we have been looking, as a host hotel, but I have received a few other suggestions for locations. 
