Is it spring yet? I don't know about you, but I am ready for some nicer weather. I know our winter started relatively mild, but certainly with the cold and snow it makes a person yearn for the nice weather. Then there is all the salt on the roads eating away all the metal on the cars. I have seen that happen personally on my 1983 280ZX Turbo when I first got it back in the mid 80's. It was my daily driver in the Chicago area for many years and I saw how little by little the rust was starting on different panels of the car. I tried to keep on top of it using rust inhibitors and other preventative measures but once it starts, it starts. Japanese cars from that era were known for rust. It was a great car though in the snow, even with regular allseason tires. The car heated up very quickly. The only issue I can recall is when it was way below freezing it would not start at times. I was told it was from frozen fuel lines. However, since I had the car exterior restored in 1995, it pretty much has not seen any inclement weather at all.

Our beloved Z is selling rather slowly in my opinion. This past quarter, Nissan sold 462 of them. That is 1,771 in 2023. Compare that to the Rogue at 271,458 last year. I have read different articles as to why they are not selling. Some say it's just the times when everyone wants an SUV. Others state it was the dealer markup that hurt sales. Do you recall the \$50K dealer markup? Then we have the high interest rates for car loans that certainly can add up for a car that starts at over \$42k. Then it may come down to availability. At the time of this article, there are 484 new Z's for sale in the US. Compare that to 1,568 Nissan Rogues. It's not just the Z. Even the Supra sales are low, or perhaps dropping is the right word.

They sold 2,652 in 2023, down from 4,952 in 2022 and 6,830 in 2021(peak sales)!!

Nissan Division 2023 year-end highlights:

- Sales of the Rogue were up 45.6% for the calendar year.
- Sales of Sentra were up 41.6% for the calendar year.
- Sales of the three-row Pathfinder crossover were up 23.9% for the calendar year.

Sales of the Kicks were up 21.8% for the calendar year.

What about the older Z's you ask? I'm glad you asked. Just recently, at the Mecum Auction in Kissimmee, a 1981 280ZX turbo with only 31 miles (serial # 00001) just sold for \$165k!! A '72 240Z with 54k miles sold for \$72k. A 1980 Tenth Anniversary with 15 miles sold for \$93.5k. I'd say they are doing well!!

As far as the club, many of you should have received the renewal notice in the last month. If you recall, we will all be renewing our memberships in January. This was voted on by the members last year. If you have not paid the dues for this year please do so. You may use PayPal on the Windy City Z Club website.
