I had never replaced it, so it seemed to make sense. But then I thought what about the water pump which sits right behind it. So I ordered

both parts from Motorsports Auto. I had never replaced a water pump before. It didn't seem too complicated, in the maintenance books I have, as well as YouTube videos. Gotta love those videos! That's why we are car people! I did start it and everything seemed to be fine. No funny noises...the rumbling was gone. I did take it out for a drive yesterday and all was well. If I ever get my engine bay judged, at least my water pump and fan clutch are nice and shiny. Bring on the summer!
